 - a. Journal article, one author

 - b. Journal article, three to six authors
Younge, D., Moreau, P., Ezzat, A., & Gray, A. (1997). Communicating with cancer patients in Saudi Arabia. *Annals New York Academy of Sciences, 809*, 309-316.
 - c. Daily newspaper article, no author
Poverty increases for women and children. (2002, August 27). *New York Times*, p. B14.
2. Examples of references to books (p. 248+ in APA Manual)
 - a. One author
Goffman, E. (1963). *Stigma: Notes on the management of spoiled identity*. New York, NY: Simon & Schuster, Inc.
 - b. Article or chapter in an edited book
Zuger, A. (1991). AIDS and the obligations of health care professionals. In F.G. Reamer (Ed.), *AIDS & Ethics* (pp. 215-239). New York, NY: Columbia University Press.
 - c. Encyclopedia or dictionary
Edwards, R.L. (Ed.). (1997). *Encyclopedia of social work* (19th ed., Vols. 1-3). Washington, DC: National Association of Social Workers.

 - a. Daily newspaper article, electronic version available by search
