- York students are required to complete (pass) three (3) Writing intensive (WI) courses: two (2) in the lower division (100-200 level) and one (1) in the upper division (300-400 level).
- If you transferred to York College with credit for General Education requirements, you must still complete one (1) WI course in the upper division within your major. If your major has no upper division WI course, you must take a WI course chosen in consultation with your major advisor.

International Business Foreign Language Requirement:

Choose 2 courses from Group I, II or III *, ** (1 course must be at the 200 level)

Group 1: Spanish (SPAN 105, SPAN 106, SPAN 107, SPAN 208, SPAN 240, SPAN 241, SPAN 242)

Group 2: French (FREN 105, FREN 106, FREN 200, FREN 213, FREN 217, FREN 240, FREN 241, FREN 340)

Group 3: Other Languages (6 credits)

Students interested in taking other foreign languages must choose six credits above the beginner's level in consultation with Business and Economics and Foreign Languages department.

Note: Students interested in the International Business Concentration must complete the Pathways College Option:

Foreign Language requirements. Transfer students must consult with their advisor prior to registering.

All foreign language courses must be taken in the same language
