ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

1. 2.0 GPA with 12 or more earned college credits from previous post-secondary institution(s) attended .
2. 2.0 GPA with less than 12 earned college credits from previous post-secondary institution(s) attended *plus one of the following*:
 - Out of HS at least one year- 80 high school average with 14 academic units
 - Out of HS less than one year- 78 high school average, 820 SAT, 12 academic units.
 - GED Score of 3000 or higher
3. Passing scores on CUNY Skills Assessment Test

Applications are currently being accepted on a space availability basis. All documents are to be submitted to the Office of Admissions, Academic Core Building (AC), Room 1B07

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

1. Non-refundable \$70 application fee
 - Application fee is waived for students who are registered at a CUNY college for Spring 2011 or Summer 2011 semester.
2. *Official* transcripts from *each* college or post-secondary institution(s) attended
3. *Official* high school transcript with less than 12 cumulative credits earned at post-secondary institution(s) attended
4. GED diploma and scores with less than 12 cumulative credits earned at post-secondary institution(s) attended
5. ***If you are [educated outside of the United States](#) and have not yet applied, a Spring 2012 application must be completed for Admissions. **Applications will not be accepted for Fall 2011 semester.**
