For students who are looking for scholarships or summer internships, this booklet includes a myriad of opportunities that you can apply to. Please note that the scholarships/internships in this booklet have no deadlines, so you are urged to apply as early as possible to be considered. These scholarships/internships are geared toward students of all majors and minor. Please note that all current scholarships/internships require a 3.0 GPA for your application to be considered.

The TCMF Scholarship/Internship booklet was created to provide opportunities that will impact your future. Highlight the scholarships that you are interested in along with the deadlines. Each scholarship/internship has its own criteria in addition to the general requirements, so you may apply for any of which you meet the criteria. Read carefully through this booklet to deter-

mine if you are interested in any of the scholarships or internships. If you have questions regarding your qualifications, please email me at Shaquille.profit@yorkmail.cuny.edu.

Here are some tips to follow on applying: Tip 1: Do not procrastinate; be organized. Tip 2: Answer all questions completely (if a scholarship/internship asks for a “maximum of 500 words,” do not write 501 words). The primary goal of writing is to write succinctly by using the most effective word(s). Tip 3: Keep it clean. Proofread your writing before you submit the application, no misspellings or other grammatical errors. Get a second pair of eyes to proofread your responses. Tip 4: Submit your application ahead of time—it shows strong organizational skills. Do not wait last minute to apply for a scholarship/internship because a rushed application indicates that you don’t care, you have bad time management skills, which could lead to imprudent typos on your application. This is your chance to make a positive impression.

Let me close by saying that if you are a York College student, you are eligible to apply to any of the scholarship/internship offered by the Thurgood Marshall College Fund (TMCF) if you meet the eligibility requirements. York College is a Predominantly Black Institution (PBI), and a TCMF-member school.

How to apply for TMCF Scholarships?

There are so many scholarship opportunities for students like you to apply for. In order to do so you must create a TMCF account.

1. All students interested in applying for TMCF opportunities must visit: apply.tmcf.org.
2. A TMCF account allows you to apply for scholarships, internships, full-time jobs and other opportunities offered by TMCF partners.
3. Once you create your account, TMCF will collect basic information from you so they can offer the most relevant opportunities. Once you have completed the basic information form, you can search the system for applications and apply to those that are interesting or relevant to you.

How to create a TMCF Account:

A Step-by-step Guide

1. First, visit: apply.tmcf.org.
2. Second, under "Need an Account?" Click: sign up.
3. Third, fill out basic information about yourself (i.e., first and last name, email address).

Please use a personal email address (not .edu) when registering.

4. Then, once you sign up, you will need to check your personal email for an account activation link. You should receive the email within a couple of minutes.
5. Once you have created an account, the first step once you have created your TMCF Account is completing the Basic Information Form. Once you have completed the form, you will be able to apply to opportunities in the system.
6. Finally, once that step is completed, on the home page, click on APPLICATION (on the top left side of the website). Scroll down and click VIEW APPLICATIONS. There, you will find all the available scholarships that matched your profile & APPLY button next to them (open date and deadline).

Description: The Leadership Institute is an award-winning and national program intended to develop students' leadership skills, create a community of scholars, provide companies access to a talented and diverse student population, and help students make connections that lead to careers. The conference culminates with a recruitment fair where Fortune 500 companies, government agencies, and graduate program representatives offer jobs, internships and continuing education opportunities. If selected to attend the Leadership Institute, you'll receive the following benefits:

Direct Access to Employers

Mandatory professional and leadership development sessions are led by experienced individuals from a variety of fields and provide a combination of concrete tools and valuable advice to help advance one's education and career.

Access to a Network of Like-Minded Individuals

There are many activities for informal and formal networking throughout the conference. Individualized networking activities include receptions, meal events, and the recruitment fair. Access a network of like-minded professionals and build life-long connections with peer leaders.

Industry Insight

Plenary and meal sessions feature keynote speeches by some of the nation's leading public speakers and corporate and government leaders. Keynote speakers inspire attendees by candidly sharing life stories, work experiences and tips on what it takes to survive in the real world.

- Science, Technology, Engineering, Agriculture, Mathematics or Business-related majors.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills.
- Able to demonstrate strong initiative and drive.

Eligible students, with a minimum grade point average of 3.0, who are pursuing degrees in biological science, natural resources management, or a related field will possess the desired qualifications for the 2021 DFP.
