A Note on the Play:

Fin de Partie was first performed at the Royal Court Theatre in London on April 3, 1957. American premiere of Endgame played at the Cherry Lane Theatre in New York, during the 1957-58 season.

To examine the human condition in *Endgame*, Beckett created an austere microcosm of locale (a shelter) and relationships (a master and servant or perhaps son, and parents and son. Power emerges as driving a force and with it, dependency.

Searching for self in this environment, characters tell powerful stories and it is not until Hamm's story is ended that a measure of resolution is found.

At York, he has appeared in The Madwoman of Chaillot (directed by Barbara Nickolich). His newest book is Branches to heaven: The Geniuses of C.S. Lewis.

Timothy J. Amrhein (Assistant Professor of Theatre Design) holds an MFA from Wayne State University. He has designed sets and costumes for various productions throughout the United States, and most recently: the first New York City revival of The Full Monty, The Fantasticks, and Yeoman of The Guard.
