# Faculty of the York College Theatre

James Como (Professor of Speech Communication) came to York in 1968, when he founded the speech discipline. He chaired the Department of Performing and Fine Arts for 15 years. He holds a Ph.D. degree in Language, Literature and Communication from Columbia University. At York, he has appeared in *The Madwoman of Chaillot* (directed by Barbara Nickolich). His newest book is *Remembering C.S. Lewis*.

Timothy J. Amrhein (Associate Professor of Theatre Design) holds an MFA from Wayne State University. He has designed sets and costumes for various productions throughout the United States, and most recently: *Twelfth Night*, and *The Merry Widow*. Some of Mr. Amrhein's past work includes the first New York City revival of *The Full Monty*, *The Fantasticks*, and *Yeoman of The Guard*.
