

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Christopher Durang is known for his irreverent mixture of parody, satire, nonsense and sharp moments of wit and hilarity. Both 'Dentity Crisis' and The Actor's Nightmare ooze of these moments and address greater, universal issues. We all struggle to define ourselves in a way that can be both comic and frightful throughout our lives. Durang takes these insecurities and exaggerates them onstage in a way that leaves us wondering about the characters we have just seen and about what we personally believe defines "individuality" and "nightmares".

We often struggle with others in our life whose strong personality imposes his or her viewpoint on others. Durang takes this theme to an extreme with his characters in 'Dentity Crisis.' We are the spectators in an arena in which finding a singular identity turns into a cacophony of personalities, leading the main character (Jane) to a complete breakdown. As we attempt to identify who we are as individuals, like Jane, we are stuck trying to understand if our lives are defined by those around us who have stronger identities or if we can truly survive as who we think we are. And, if we can survive, do we put ourselves in a situation that leaves us without a script or a path to travel down?

The Actor's Nightmare is just that—a look at what would happen if we were dumped into a situation where everyone else knew their parts, but we didn't have a clue. No matter what situation we get into on a daily basis, we always feel we know the part we are to play. However, Durang examines our deepest fear of not knowing our role and presents it in a way that becomes completely theatrical. Like our quest for individuality, many nights we lie awake pondering about tomorrow. Will we be prepared? Will things go as planned? How do we deal with change? These universal questions drive us through our daily routines and shape us as we grow older. No matter what the situation, we never want to be completely "lost" in the action of the moment. Like George, we want to know our lines, know the play and be able to give the world our best performance.

Without self-identity and a somewhat scripted day, we all tend to feel like George...with our head on the chopping block. What better way to feel good about ourselves than to sit back and enjoy watching Durang's characters go through what we would prefer not to. And they do it in a way that leaves us in stitches. Enjoy!

NOTE: Although Speech Communication students may take as much Theatre Arts practica as they please, no more than 6 credits of Theatre Arts practica may be applied towards the fulfillment of the Speech Communication Concentration; however, Theatre Arts students may apply 9 credits of Theatre Arts Practica towards the fulfillment of the Theatre Arts Concentration. Theatre Arts *practica* courses currently include TA215-19.

*All SpeechComm/TA majors must take SPCH 101 as a Prereg for completion of the Major. Majors in Speech Communication/Theatre Arts must fulfill their General Education Requirements in a discipline other than their major.

TIMOTHY J. AMRHEIN (Chair of the Department of Performing and Fine Arts and an Associate Professor of Theatre) holds an M.F.A. from Wayne State University in Theatre Design and Technology. Prior to his arrival at York College, he served as the faculty technical director and designer at the University of Pittsburgh and the faculty designer at Schoolcraft College Livonia, MI. Though Mr. Amrhein is known for his scenic and costume designs on the York College stage and throughout the tri-state area. he has directed several productions as well. Some of his past directorial credits

include: Le Bourgeois Gentilhomme, Dreamgirls, La Luz De Un Cigarrillo, RENT, SlapDASH, All in the Timing, FAME the Musical, Yo Soy Latina, Scapin, Little Shop of Horrors, Anna in the Tropics, Oleanna, Into the Woods and Once Upon A Mattress. Mr. Amrhein has also designed both costumes and scenery throughout the United States. Some of his most recent designs have been No Exit, Galileo, Endgame, Charley's Aunt and Antigone (York College), the first New York City revival of *The Full Monty* and *The Fantasticks* (The Gallery Players) and Twelfth Night (Princeton Repertory Shakespeare Festival). Other design and directing credits include work for the Village Light Opera Group, the Princeton Repertory Shakespeare Festival, the River Rep Theatre Company, the Wings Theatre, The Second City (Detroit and Toronto), Carnegie Mellon University, and the California Repertory Theatre. He received the Best Scenic Design award from the NJ Star Ledger for The Merry Wives of Windsor, the Detroit Free Press's Theatre Excellence Award for Saturday, Sunday, Monday and Scapin and most recently the Award for Creative Excellence for his set design of The Hedge from the Arts in Christian Theatre. Prof. Amrhein has also translated the Dominican play, La Luz De Un Cigarrillo, by Marco Antonio Rodriguez from Spanish into English with the help of the cast. The English premier was performed in October of 2012 at York College. He is a member of United Scenic Artists, Local 829 and the United States Institute for Theatre Technology.

(an evening of six plays at Manhattan Theatre Club, 1994, (including the Tennessee Williams' parody, *For Whom the Southern Belle Tolls*), *Sex and Longing* (Lincoln Center Theatre production at the Cort Theatre, 1996, starring Sigourney Weaver), and *Betty's Summer Vacation* (Playwrights Horizons, 1999; Obie award).
