



Director's Notes:

The Last Days of Judas Iscariot was written by the wonderful Pulitzer Prize winning playwright, director and actor Stephen Adly Guirgis and originally produced by LAByrinth Theatre Company. It opened March 2, 2005 at The Public Theatre in New York City, and was directed by Philip Seymour Hoffman. The play is a comedy that posits the question if God is all-forgiving then, surely, the least of his creatures is worthy of that forgiveness. That least creature is Judas Iscariot, the betrayer of Jesus Christ, who hung himself from an olive tree. Judas is on trial for the murder of Jesus in a ghetto in purgatory.

Guirgis sets his play in a courtroom of sorts where the damned and the saintly give evidence on whether Judas should be forgiven — found not guilty. But Judas himself does not participate in his own defense, as he sits catatonic, inured to the witnesses pro and against. He sits in a prison of his own making: a prison of despair and hopelessness.

The trial consists of witnesses from history such as Mother Theresa, Sigmund Freud, as well as Caiaphas the Elder, Pontius Pilate, and Satan himself. The testimonies can be outrageous, funny, and touching. Guirgis manages to make this the trial of all time with his use of contemporary language that makes these figures immediate and current. For instance, Saint Monica, the mother of Saint Augustine, and a voice for Judas warns, "Better not get up in my grill cuz I'll mess your shit up cuz I'm a Saint and I got mad Saintly connects." The language is a contemporary vernacular complete with jokes and foul language. A vernacular of the common folk that is not heavenly or high. Some might take offense at this language, but the goal is to bring these figures closer to us. And Guirgis achieves that goal with great skill in this funny yet touching piece.

TOM MARION (Associate Prof. of Theatre and Theatre Arts Coordinator) holds an M.F.A. in Acting from Rutgers' Mason Gross School of the Arts (with Bill Esper), a Certificate of Vocal Coaching from The National Theatre Conservatory (with Tony Church), and an internship with The Royal Shakespeare Company (with Cecily Berry and Andrew Wade.) He is a Designated Teacher of Linklater Voice, a founding member of the Linklater Center for Voice and Language, and an Associate



Teacher of Fitzmaurice Voicework. He has taught at several studios and professional actor programs in NYC, including NYU, The Actors' Center, Marymount Manhattan College, The New School, and Columbia University. At York Prof. Marion has directed A Midsummer Night's Dream, Macbeth, Fabulation, The Exonerated, The Tempest, Live Laugh Love Cryl., Romeo & Juliet, and was the creator/director of Istwa! (Which performed at the 2011 International Fringe Festival, NYC) and SPEAK OUT (which performed at The Bowery Poetry Club in Manhattan and at York as part of Black History Month.) Recently, he presented the York College Theatre OUTREACH original production of Langston Hughes in Harlem at LaMama ETC, and the new play The Water Carriers at the Midtown International Theatre Festival.

BARBARA NICKOLICH (*Prof. Emerita of Theatre*) received her formal theatre training from Wheaton College, Northwestern University and New York University. In addition, she has been a student of Bobby Troka, voice coach, in NYC. She has appeared as a performer and director with the CUNY Readers Theatre.
