Goals for 2016-17	1) Generate income for charitable health related activities. 2) Reach out to pending members in an effort to have those members' complete requirements for induction.	*March of Dimes Walk involved (altogether) over 50 students that generated \$1,512.00. *Successful completion of requirements for several pending members-forty six students inducted.
Amount of Students Using Services this Past Year:	There were 116 new students this year (approximately 30% were inducted this semester). In total, there are over 2,200 members in the chapter. This includes over 600 inducted members and over 600 alumni members.	
Types of Services Provided:	Leadership Training (Service Learning, Success Networking Teams and Video Presentations are the primary components).	Each tenet of the program actively engages students in extracurricular activities that promote "leadership initiative". Studies have shown that students that are involved in some form of leadership activity in college have better persistence rates (GPA, Retention, Graduation) than those that are not involved.

<p>Amount of Events Staged this Year and # Students Attending Each Event:</p>	<p>There have been eleven major events this year (but several meetings). For each of our Orientations (5), there have been between 10-30 students (total between 120-130 students). The Leadership Training Days (5) allowed for full leadership training workshops to be conducted with the students. The Induction Ceremony included 47 students.</p>	<p>The Orientations allowed students to be integrated into the program while engaging them in activities with other students and the Leadership Training Days allowed students to learn leadership skills and prepared them for induction. The Induction Ceremony validated the work that the students were involved in throughout the year, with a certification of full membership into the National Society of Leadership and Success after completion of the standard requirements.</p>
