

MCC-TL (Technological Literacy)

- Develop solutions to problems using appropriate technologies
- Conduct an effective search on the internet to achieve a desired outcome
- Create a document using technology that meets specific criteria
- Organize files and other resources effectively within folders on a computer, in web cloud storage, or within apps on mobile devices so that each is easy to locate at a later time
- Integrate appropriate technological applications for a specific purpose
- Select the appropriate technology to fulfill a specific purpose

MCC-IL (Information Literacy)

- Locate needed information
- Evaluate sources for appropriate format and credibility
- Use information effectively to accomplish a specific purpose
- Acknowledge sources in an appropriate documentation style

MCC-SSD (Social Science and Diversity)

- Define diversity as it relates to the discipline of study
- Explain how dimensions of diversity such as social class, gender, or race influence various issues in public discourse
- Apply specific theories or perspectives to diverse issues
- Compare similarities or differences among cultures, global or domestic
- Evaluate how human similarities or differences influence our society
- Interact effectively with others who differ demographically or culturally from one's self

MCC-CT (Critical Thinking)

- Evaluate arguments as they occur in the works of others
- Develop well-reasoned arguments in their own work
- Solve discipline-specific problems in a meaningful or creative way
- Contextualize by considering ideas, artifacts, texts, or events as framed by the historical, cultural, or political circumstances in which they were developed
- Reason logically in their own written, verbal, or demonstrative work
- Synthesize information for the purpose of discipline-specific understanding, conceptualization, or application
- Create and test hypotheses specific to the discipline

MCC-VE (Values and Ethics)

- Apply appropriate moral norms to make an ethical decision regarding an ethical dilemma.
- Cite appropriate professional ethics codes for responding to ethical decisions in the workplace.
- List strategies for responding to threats to ethical decision-making and values.
- Explain the personal or social benefits of behaving according to accepted ethical principles and values.
- State ethical principles associated with managing information (information: data, shared information, statistical testing, and employment specific information).
- Describe acceptable methods of resolving conflicts arising from cultural differences that influence ethics.
- Discuss conflicts that can result when personal values differ from established ethical principles.
- Analyze an ethical case study using established methods of ethical problem-solving.
