### B. ADMISSION AND RETENTION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

In addition to a general admission application to York College, students must apply for admission to the Social Work Program. The program admits applicants each semester. The deadline for applications is July 31<sup>st</sup> for the fall semester and January 31<sup>st</sup> for the spring semester. Interested incoming students are invited to use the application on the website: <https://www.york.cuny.edu/social-work/bs/admission>.

#### **The criteria for admission are as follows:**

1. Matriculation at York College.
2. Completion of the A.S. degree in Human Services from Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC).
3. Cumulative GPA of 2.7 or higher
4. Grade of "C" or higher in all SCWK courses (including transfer)
5. Completion of the BSSW Program Application form.
6. Transfer students do not need to be in residence at York to submit the social work application. They can apply to the program after they have been accepted to the College.
7. Starting fall 2025, incoming baccalaureate scholars will be sent an acceptance letter from the department chairperson.

#### **The criteria for retention in the Social Work Program are:**

1. A grade of "C" or better in each Social Work course.  
Students who earn an unacceptable grade in any Social Work course have one chance to repeat that course and earn an acceptable grade.
2. Departmental permission is required to repeat Field Placement & Seminar (Social Work 410 or 492).
3. Maintenance of a cumulative GPA of 2.70 or higher.
3. Adherence to the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) Code of Ethics and to the York College Code of Conduct.

*Failure to meet any one of the criteria listed above may be grounds for the student's dismissal by faculty.*

### **Admission to Social Work Field Education**

Field Education comprises of SCWK 410 and SCWK 492.

Students must apply for admission to Social Work Field Education. Admission to Social Work Field Education is a prerequisite for SCWK 410 and successful completion of SCWK 410 is a prerequisite for SCWK 492.

Criteria for admission to Field Education are:

1. Admission to the Social Work Program
2. A cumulative York College GPA of 2.70 or higher
3. A grade of "C" or higher for all social work courses
4. Successful completion of 94 or more credits by the end of the semester in which the student applies
5. Successful completion of all required social work courses (100-300 levels)
6. Successful completion of Writing 303
7. Successful completion of two courses from the approved list of human diversity courses (see Human Diversity Requirement)
8. Completion of the Social Work Field Education Application form

### **Graduation Requirements**

To earn a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Social Work degree from York College, Associate in Science (AS) degree graduates must:

- complete at least 40 credits at York College
- complete at least half of the credits in the major program at York College
- complete the College Option requirement of EITHER two writing intensive courses at the 200-level or above OR WRIT 301/302/303/304 AND one writing intensive course at the 200-level or above (WRIT 303) (SCWK 400)
- complete one writing intensive course in the upper division of the curriculum (at the 300-level or above) within the major (SCWK 400)
- Have 60 liberal arts credits as required for the B.S. degree
- Have a Grade Point Average of 2.7 or better (major and overall)
- Complete elective courses, if needed
- If more than 64 credits are transferred students may not graduate with honors. A minimum of 56 credits must be completed at York College to graduate with honors

**C. TRANSFER CREDIT AWARDED**

## G. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:  
When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons.
2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:  
Each semester, York College will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:  
This articulation agreement will be published on the BMCC website and the York College website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
4. Campus Updates to Transfer Credit Rules:  
Each college will update their transfer rules in CUNY first based on the agreed upon course evaluation, as indicated in this document. When either college makes course revisions to courses included in the agreement, they will notify the other party.
