B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Purpose

This agreement is a formal commitment of the partnership between Queensborough Community College and York College and their mutual commitment to help facilitate, for those who desire, the completion of the bachelor's degree in public health.

This agreement is designed to help students be prepared to apply to the bachelor's degree program because they have completed all of the pre-requisites and finished relevant coursework that increases their competitiveness for acceptance.

This articulation agreement does not confer automatic transfer admission to York College's Bachelor of Science Degree Program in Public Health for students who have earned the Associate's Degree in Public Health at Queensborough Community College.

Admission Requirements

Students will have completed an A.S. in Public Health from Queensborough Community College, with the following additional requirements:

- Completion of 60 credits at time of admission to the program (courses may still be in progress after applying to Public Health major and before entering the program in spring or fall)
- GPA of 3.0 in all required program courses (including program electives) and a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Completion of the following additional required courses for York College B.S. Public Health:

Note: Queensborough students will also complete two writing intensive (WI) courses.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each semester York College will provide Queensborough Community College the following information: (1) the number of Queensborough students who applied to the program; (2) the number of Queensborough students who enrolled; and (4) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the Queensborough Community College's website and the York College websites. Faculty involved in the program and all advisers will promote this agreement with eligible students.
