Students heard welcoming remarks from President Eanes and Provost Brazill before receiving some helpful hints about college success from Dean Salnave of Student Development. The program continued with informative presentations from departments such as The Counseling Center, Academic Advisement and The Career Center. A fundamental component for first-year student success is understanding the resources available to them. However, peer-to-peer engagement allows for social skill building and helps cultivate a student's connection to the college. The NSO's student panel offered the opportunity

The Welcome Center was established in August 2021 and is the gateway to our campus. It is a one-stop resource for prospective, current, and returning students, as well as visitors. The Center provides students with the opportunity to engage with success coordinators who help students navigate the admissions process; clarify enrollment procedures; and explain requirements for financial aid, advisement, and registration.



Students registered with The Center for Student with Disabilities (CSD) have had an active, healthy and vibrant summer. Things kicked off with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) BBQ, a fun day filled with hot dogs, games and conversation. 
