
## Types of Paragraphs: Generalization and Examples

Within the basic structure of the paragraph, you have options for writing different types of paragraphs that present information in different ways.

The generalization and example type of paragraph works like this:

- 1. The *topic sentence* makes a claim.
- 2. The *supporting details* provide illustrative examples.
- 3. The *concluding sentence* ties your examples together, reiterates the main idea, and provides a transition to the next paragraph.
